Details of the wounded

A Jewish Chronicle article of June 11th 1915 lists the wounded of the Corps up till that date ie D. Bronski, Gordenzik, Engleman, Uriah, Isaac, Silberman, Wurth, Hyam, Abram, Rachmiloff, Daniel Missulam, Elie Sibourg, Gustav Isaac, Meyer Peretz (at first missing in action and then discovered in hospital at Alexandria). On July 9th Isaac Kopf, Jacob Friendlish and Solomon Himmo were wounded and on Aug 6th the following men were named as wounded - Sargeants. Michael Cohen, Nathan Kaplan, Shub Leb and Ishail Cohen, with Lance Corporal Marcus Kassab, and Privates Elia Castel, I. Caplane, Isaac Elkaim, S. Jutznumik, Z. Keezlia, Solomon Levi, Matatiya Okuka, Mayer Perg, Nissel Rosenberg, Isaac Saban, Shullman, Isaac Alkaim and Solomon Lew. On October 10th it was reported that Corporall Marcus Kessab had been wounded in action.
